Part 1

BIM is an acronym that is much used and very much misunderstood. It is not a new term — it was first coined in the 1970s — nor does any one party own it, commercially or collectively. This partly explains one of the problems with it: Because no organisation can claim ownership or oversight, clear definitions and standards have been slow to emerge and confusion has spread.

This situation has been exacerbated by some parties inappropriately or tenuously jumping on the Building Information Modelling (BIM) bandwagon in an attempt to leapfroa the competition or re-launch existing products and / or services.

Isn't this just CAD with bells on?

It is not simply a case of applying traditional tech niques to a new technology, but the adoption of new methodologies and business practices that denote BIM. Aspects of BIM will replace the drawing production side of CAD as it will similarly replicate some of the actions traditionally performed by spreadsheets and databases for auantitative analysis and component specification.

It is a common misconception that buying a piece of software is the answer to adopting a new business / design strategy. Also affected will be the team structure, job titles and project management: communication with suppliers and contractors; client deliverables; collaboration with other project stakeholders; fee structures and contract form; legal liabilities; insured risk and mitigation; and the benefits and rewards can be equally comprehensive, but only if the adoption of the process and workflow is managed well.

How and where do I buy BIM?

Does Revit equal BIM and BIM equal Revit? Several misconceptions need to be explained, including the idea that buying a piece of software is the

What are BIM Dimension?

For the practical purposes of BIM, there are six 'D's that have relative industry agreement

- 1D A Point
- **2D** Line Drawing
- 3D Modelled Solids and Surfaces
- 4D Time and Sequence
- 5D Costino
- 6D Building Lifecycle Management and Facilities Management

The above will have a greater or lesser involvement in your BIM workflow, depending upon your discipline and choice, but also on the demands of the clients and project stakeholders.

Is BIM relevant to me?

You may be thinking that BIM is only really of interest to architects and engineers, possibly contractors as well. Certainly those parties may choose to take on BIM and make it a core aspect of their business because it can improve the quality and efficiency of their delivery.

But they are not the only people to whom BIM is relevant. The decision to get involved in BIM can be simplified with a succession of questions leading to the most appropriate solution. This will be covered in Part 2 of this article. Short answer is YES!!

BIM terminology and principles

It is impractical to suggest that any organisation will take a single step to go from reliance upon 2D drawings using CAD to a full collaborative BIM workflow. In fact there are four defined levels of BIM adoption:

Level 0: 2D CAD Level 1: 3D CAD Level 2: Siloed BIM Level 3: Collaborative BIM


As can be seen in the graphic below, there is overlap between the levels of CAD and BIM use and there is a natural process of ascendancy that is commonly followed during the adoption of BIM.

Level 1 — Is it CAD or BIM?

It is not uncommon to find that software such as Revit, ArchiCAD or other BIM-capable applications are used to deliver drawings, but all BIM aspects are effectively ignored in the process. This is no better than 3D CAD and the model is used purely for aesthetic and graphical interrogation, effectively missing the 'I' out of the acronym and leaving a Buildina Model.

Big BIM and little BIM

It is only when BIM data is transferred between stakeholders and used in a collaborative sense that the full capabilities are realised.



After more than a year of pushing and pulling, we are now starting to get into the flow of things. As responsibilities are becoming clearer, it is crucial that everyone stay focus and don't get complacent on personal life as well as at work.

Since we primarily focus on BIM work, this is not only new to our industry but also new to us therefore the challenge is for us to adapt and learn its process in order to perfect our duties.

Nothing is more important than the morale of the workers in any company. If everyone loves their iob, then the sky is the limit. Especially since our work requires much more collaboration effort and team work. It is crucial that we all get along and work effective together.

We can certainly see the effort that everyone puts in to work together as a team especially when the going gets tough. We know that in order to build a



successful company takes time and effort and it all starts with everyone in this office.

We can only achieve greatness when every person in this office works together as a single unit and achieve their own personal success. As we close out the year, we want everyone to know that as bumpy as it seems, we are certainly heading down the right path.

Level 2 — Siloed BIM

Siloed BIM, known as Little BIM is seen as a means to an end in terms of production, alteration and management of drawings and is often the first step in a BIM implementation

Level 3 — Collaborative BIM

Also known as Collaborative BIM, iBIM or Bia BIM, this is the ideal to which we should aspire as an industry. It does not dictate that all parties utilise the same software platform, but that electronic communication between platforms is fully explored and

Ideally, data is regularly passed between all parties and frequent meetings see the collation of the virtual building design incorporating all disciplines.-Such meetings would identify clashes and assign resolution of issues. Each team should have access to the BIM data of other parties as a backdrop to their design activity and the client or contractor would be able to see and interact with the process.

The final deliverable of the workflow would be a fully laden 3D model containing all associated meta-data. The production of drawings might still be required by construction workers but need no longer be an integral aspect of design delivery.

We are very very close to achieving success with our BIM work. But we need to stay sharp and be prepared to take on the challanges that lie ahead.



Managing Revit and CAD Links

- > Check and double check that all linked CAD and Revit files in every file are linked with a relative path.
- > Do not link using <u>UNC</u> paths
- > Use Drive Letter Mapping (ie: L:/) for all links
- > Keep all of Revit files within the same Revit folder so that relative pathing is simple and always works.
- > Common file naming here is very helpful.

he 230 Nguyen Trai mixed-use complex is a development by Trung Thuy Group. This project has approximately 75,000 square meters of floor area, with 4 basement levels, 4 podium levels, 29 levels of residential and stands over 100 meters high.

We were lucky enough to be awarded with this project as the main Architect as well as the BIM Consultant. This will be the first fully-realized BIM project for our company from concept through construction and we hope to execute it in its entirety to earn the title as the first completed BIM project in Vietnam.

The unique features of this project includes the terrace level pool that cantilever over the Podium, the sky-deck garden terraces and the three-level height space between the residential blocks. This design is a vision lead by Aaron and executed by the design team starting with Steven, Quynh, Tam, Nhi and Tin.

After 6 months of site adjustments and concept re-design , the architectural concept design was finally accepted by the client in early August and the concept is currently being wrapped up and transitioning into Schematic - which will heavily involve the BIM team.
